BUILDING RELATIONSHIPS WITH PEOPLE IN CHRIST

STEEPLE TALK

Pastoring at BRPC has been a great privilege and joy, with, of course, a few challenges mixed in. But one of the greatest joys of ministry is the ability, indeed the mandate, for a pastor to spend time delving into God's word for teaching, preaching and personal study. I have always felt an excitement and sense of adventure upon approaching scriptural study for my next sermon. With that in mind, in this last Steeple Talk article, I thought I would share with you some of my favorite passages of scripture – as we both, you and I, prepare to embark on the next chapter of our journeys of faith.

In the beginning when God created the heavens and earth, the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the water. Then God said, 'Let there be light'; and there was light. (Genesis 1:1-3) Remember that God is the beginning and end of all, and simply by a spoken word, provides light amidst the darkness.

But [Moses] said, "O my Lord, please send someone else." (Exodus 4:13) I love how the Bible keeps it real! Time and again, God calls ordinary people to do God's work in the world. God calls me, God calls you.

"Where you go, I will go; where you lodge I will lodge; your people will be my people, and your God my God." (Ruth 1:16) Ruth embodies devotion, loyalty, humility and compassion. Might we extend such care to one another.

This is the day that the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad in it. (Psalm 118:24) This is the trumpet song for each Sunday of worship; it's an affirmation of the gift of every day where we can breathe, praise God, and serve the Lord!

If I take the wings of the morning and settle at the farthest limits of the sea, even there your hand shall lead me, and your right hand shall hold me fast. (Psalm 139: 9 – 10) There is no place where we are beyond the reach, care and grace of God.

But let justice roll down like waters, and righteousness like an ever-flowing stream. (Amos 5:24) The prophets (and Christ) remind us of the imperative to work for the weak, the oppressed, and for a more just world.

"You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength." 31 The second is this, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these." (Mark 12:30 – 31) The call of our faith, in a nutshell.

"Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food? . . . Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me." (Matthew 25: 37, 40) How we choose to treat others is how we choose to treat Christ.

But while he was still far off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion; he ran and put his arms around him and kissed him. (Luke 15:20) God is always seeking the lost and welcomes them (us) home.

"Put your finger here and see my hands . . . Do not doubt but believe." Thomas answered him "My Lord and my God!" (John 20: 27-28) Following resurrection, there is grace, forgiveness, and then profession of faith.

But God proves God's love for us in that while we still were sinners, Christ died for us. (Romans 5: 8) What love! And it reminds us that we are not the architects of our salvation, God is.

And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love. (1 Corinthians 13:13) My current sermon series!

Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say rejoice . . . The Lord is near. (Philippians 4:4-5) This life of faith of ours is a source of great joy, as well as meaning and purpose. May we remember each day that "The Lord is near."

As soon as I selected these passages, others popped into my mind. I realize I needed more space, more time to speak of these gospel truths. But I know that those who follow me in the pulpit, and you, will pick up that charge.

Session at Work

The session had our final Stated meeting with Pastor Pat as moderator. The clerk was directed to record our appreciation and note that he is leaving the session and our whole church in better condition than he found us. And secondly, it demonstrates that Blue Ridge Presbyterian Church is a community rooted in the worship Jesus Christ, and that even in this time of transition, the church looks forward!

When taking communion to a homebound member in May, it made me realize some of these members, while appreciative of being able to participate in the sacrament of communion, also are so very happy to visit with members receiving updates of all that happens at BRPC. The deacons do a great job keeping in contact with these members, but we all can minister to these friends with a visit or a call when we have a spare minute.

As a gift of remembrance to Pastor Pat, there is a picture of the church. Please sign the mat. He wants a reminder of each of us. There are two occasions we have to show our appreciation to Pastor Pat, Janet, Elyse and Doris. First is the dinner on Saturday, June 9th at 5:30 p.m. Anyone needing a ride should contact your deacon, Sharon in the office or me. We will assure you a ride. The second is Sunday June 10th after worship when we and members of the community and Presbytery are invited to visit with the Jackson's and Doris in a special coffee fellowship.

Pastor Pat, please know you are leaving with our prayers. May God bless you and your family as you take this next step.
