It's all About the King

It's Monday at 11:45 a.m. I'm in the cafeteria of Blue Ridge Elementary School, waiting for the kids to come for our weekly chess club gathering. Nathaniel, Gordon, Cyiree and Elijah walk over with their sack lunches or cafeteria trays topped with pizza, some carrots and a carton of juice or milk. They get settled and I ask them: "Do you remember how we win a game of chess?"

Our church is in its third year of our involvement with Blue Ridge Elementary through the Caring for Kids initiative that joins faith communities, businesses and schools together to help children thrive. Research demonstrates that each child who has another adult connected to their life on a regular basis (outside of the home and besides their primary school teacher) has a significantly increased likelihood of graduating from high school. So it's not so much the chess itself that is important -- although the thinking discipline and lesson that the moves we make in life have consequences is very important. But the most vital thing about chess club is that showing up each week tells these kids that they matter. To me. To our church.

"You have to capture the king!" exclaimed Cyiree. "That's right," I say, "Or 'trap' the king as we said last week."

This year (so far!), Carol McCoy, Barbara Ham, my wife Janet and I are volunteering at the school. Carol has agreed to serve as the BRPC point person. We would love to have more folks in the congregation join in this ministry to the children and teachers who are laboring away each day 150 feet from our own front doors.



There are two main volunteer options at the school. You can sign up to be a **general volunteer** who pitches in for special occasions. There is no special training needed for this or regular time commitment. The next special event at the school is the **PTA Carnival on November 17th** from 6:00 – 8:00 p.m. The school needs volunteers to help staff the games and activity stations.

A second way to be involved is to sign up to be a **"Rayfriend."** Rayfriends volunteer in a particular classroom once a week for (usually) an hour and help kids with reading or math. Depending on the teacher's needs, you might work with one student, a small group of students, or you could assist the teacher with the whole class.

In order to be a Rayfriend, you need to go through a Rayfriend Training at the District Office (6608 Raytown Rd). The next training will **Thursday, Nov. 9th at 2:00 p.m.** I'll be going since my prior training has expired.

Please let Carol McCoy or me know if you'd like to become involved in this ministry of supporting the kids and staff of Blue Ridge Elementary School.

After this class has been elected, they will be required to come before the session as the final step before

installation and/or ordination. In my opinion, we will have a fine team of officers for the next years.

On a personal note, I would like to express my thanks for all the support I have received these past months. It is most comforting to continue my involvement in several ways. Each week Bill Melewski posts the sermon on the church's website and that allows me to participate in worship from home. Through the use of conference calls, I have been able to attend meetings. I would like to remind those at home that videos are available of the full sermon. Please take advantage by letting your deacon know you would appreciate them. This is one up-lifting way to worship with the church family when you cannot be there in person.
